The discussion will be particularly relevant for those involved in the management of green space, whether its development, upkeep or use to deliver health and wellbeing outcomes, from health and social care professionals to local planning authorities.

Austerity has led to decreased local authority budgets and income for non-governmental organisations, resulting in significant impacts on funding for green infrastructure. It is more than likely that budgets for green infrastructure will continue to decrease despite the benefits it has provided people during the Covid-19 pandemic. There is a growing need, therefore, to understand what alternative mechanisms exist to fund green infrastructure and related interventions, and how these can be accessed. We will present our latest report, which summarises the breadth of funding mechanisms available, including both traditional and alternative funding streams, and hear from our speakers about innovation in funding green space. The panel will talk about their own experiences followed by a discussion and Q&A.
